Preventing and Managing Prosthetic Complications in the Implant Patient

Complications associated with implant-assisted prostheses are not unusual. Everyday practice utilizing dental implants requires planning to avoid complications where possible, and to overcome them once they have occurred.

This lecture will introduce and discuss these complications as they relate to the restoration of dental implants. Planning and treatment options designed to prevent the occurrence of complications will be detailed. Patient examples will be considered that illustrate options to reduce complications and treatment of them once they have occurred.

Course Objectives:

- Understand clinical compromises that arise from improper implant placement, and explore techniques to address them
- Become familiar with current techniques to remove implants
- Understand the drawbacks to cemented restorations and understanding the proper utilization and design of custom abutments
- Manage abutment screw fracture and loosening
- Manage worn Locator[®] abutments and bars
- Troubleshoot material wear and fracture
